The prize is a visit with Leo Stan the Science Man. Kayla watches his YouTube channel. He is her hero. She plans to win.




"Leo Stan is so smart! Meeting him would be amazing!" Kayla tells her team.

Tina looks unsure. Then she raises hers.


Kayla grins. "Great! Solar energy it is!"






Lindsey is the team captain. She calls a meeting after school.
