



Albert Einstein





Albert Einstein was born in Germany in 1879. He became famous as a scientist and as one of the most important thinkers of our times. In 1933 when the dictator Adolph Hitler came to power in Germany, Einstein left his native land for good. Einstein was a Jew. Hitler hated Jews. In 1940 Albert Einstein became a citizen of the United States.


Although he made many important discoveries, he is best known for his theory of relativity. This law became the most famous equation in science. It read $E=mc^2$. "E" stands for energy, "m" stands for matter, and "c" stands for the speed of light multiplied by itself.

Albert especially liked to listen to his mother and friends perform Mozart's violin sonatas.










The violin was a pleasure to him

Albert's Uncle Jakob was an engineer in the family business.


Albert, what is the trouble?

We are hunting for a little animal. We don't know its name, so we call it "x."




We hunt for it. We catch it! We give it its right name.

Yes! I see!






At home ...

Then we will move to Italy!






That's just what I want, to move to another country.

In 1902 thanks to his friend Marcel, he was appointed to a job in the Swiss Patent Office in Berne.


Your job is to study the model, see if it holds a new idea. Then write up papers that will protect the inventor.

He wrote to a friend ...


The first paper is on the radiation and energy of light and is very revolutionary. The fourth changes the theory of space and time.

This Einstein is a madman.







The Zurich professors were embarrassed.

One day he had visitors.


The best scientists in the world work in Germany. We want you to work there.
